

Housing Commission Recommendations

Legislature's Labor and Housing
Committee will consider a bill
containing recommendations from
the Housing Commission's final
report, including:

- Permit ADUs by right
- Eliminate single family zone
- Incentivize affordable housing development
- Create statewide affordable housing appeals board for local denials

Funding from Congressional Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill

Highlights for Maine:

- \$1.3 billion in highway and bridge program formula funding;
- \$19 million across five years to expand electric vehicle charging infrastructure;
- \$241 million over five years to improve public transportation options; and
- At least \$100 million to expand high-speed broadband across Maine.





Allow accessory dwelling units by right

Eliminate singlefamily zoning restrictions in all residential zones. Prohibit municipal growth caps on the production of new housing.

Provide technical and financial assistance to municipalities in making zoning improvements

Create density bonuses in all residential zones.

Create a three-year statewide incentive program for municipalities.

Create a system of priority development areas

Eliminate the terms character, overcrowding of land, and undue concentration of population as legal bases for zoning regulations.

Create a state-level housing appeals board to review denials of affordable housing projects made at the local level.






